They applied their understanding of ratio and proportion to upscale recipes before researching and calculating the cost of the ingredients, including considering the most effective way of purchasing the products. They also created table number cards, signs and chocolate gift boxes which they decorated and filled with homemade truffles.

The children then became chefs, chopping and preparing all the ingredients before cooking a chilli and making cheesecake. On the night, they ran the restaurant, from setting the tables and welcoming the guests to serving the 3-course meal and clearing the tables. The restaurant was an amazing success -well done Year 6!
