Throughout the day, they followed the journey of a 10 year old Jewish boy (Leo), who lived at the time of the Holocaust in Germany. They had the opportunity to see real artefacts from the period; immerse themselves in a recreation of a Jewish home and a German school room; before walking along the cobbled streets of a German street, following the horrors of 'The Night of Broken Glass.' They then had the opportunity to learn about the children who were evacuated on the 'Kindertransport,' as well as experience the living conditions of the Jewish people left behind in hiding.
